Department Updates

Instruction

Central Campus

Congratulations to **Brian Parker**, faculty for Broadcasting Video Production, for receiving this year's Exceptional Faculty Award! (Read more about his award below.)

The Advanced Technology and Computer Science department joined the Microsoft Learn for Educators institution-level program. Microsoft Learn for Educators takes the best of Microsoft Learn online learning paths and supporting instructor-led training materials and brings it into the classroom. Eligible educators and faculty members at colleges, universities, community colleges, polytechnics, and secondary schools can access Microsoft ready-to-teach curriculum and teaching materials aligned to industry-recognized Microsoft Certifications. These certifications augment a student's existing degree path and validate the skills needed to be successful across a variety of technical careers.

The cyber lab is working towards completion and eventual Fall 2023 grand opening. It will then work to partner with local middle and high school cyber/IT programs that cannot afford or do not have cyber labs so that they can use the space in partnership with our students.

Downtown Campus

During the first week of April, OTA students participated in a collaboration with Occupational Therapy students at the University of Puget Sound (UPS). This collaboration focused on the intra-professional relationship between occupational therapists and occupational therapy assistants by means of shared intervention strategies at the adult on-site clinic at UPS.

Denturist faculty, **Naser Al-Tameemi**, presented at the Washington Denturist Association conference on a clinical and technical system of which he is the only certified instructor in the U.S.

South Campus

The Diesel and Heavy Equipment Technology program coordinated and hosted a Diesel Job Fair at South Campus. Recruiters from more than 13 diesel industry partners showed our students the benefits of working for them. More than 100 students met with recruiters and many of them have started the application process. The faculty have received very positive feedback from all participants.

The Child Studies faculty hosted the Alphabet Preschool annual training. More than 90 participants

from various Alphabet Preschools in our area received a full day of training and workshops at Bates Technical College.

They are learning new ways to support students and are partnering with our retention specialists to build support, alerts and personal interactions with students to aid them in overcoming obstacles.

4. Registration

1. In ctclink, we have completed the Academic Advisement Report, AAR, for the Machinist AAS. The AAR is a tool that helps students track their progress towards a degree. To date, we have completed 11 AARs. Two additional staff have been trained to build AARs so that we can complete building them for all our programs.

2. Registration has initiated the automated Class Waitlist process for Summer Quarter 2023. This process runs multiple times each day checking for class availability in full sections. As students are added into class sections, we have automated email sent to students notifying them they have been added to the Class. Registration will shut down the process on the first day of Summer Quarter.
3. Having completed the drop for non-payment process for the first time in ctcLink for Spring Quarter 2023, our department has implemented additions to further streamline the process for Summer Quarter. Registration has worked closely with Finance and Financial Aid to coordinate our efforts. An automated communication using Message Center was set up to remind students of the upcoming due dates.
4. Registration supports the Child Studies Department each quarter by completing mass enrollments into class sections. We have completed the mass enrollments for 48 Class Sections for Summer Quarter. That is a total of 660 enrollments processed.
5. **Campus Life and Activities**
 1. FY2324 S&A Budget was approved on April 24, 2023, by the Board of Trustees.
 2. PTK Magic Show, April 25, 2023 in the South Auditorium was a great hit.
 3. Free Student Shop Day offered several students free clothing on May 2, 2023.
 4. Mental Health Awareness event on May 3, 2023 had 56 students and 6 vendors from various organizations throughout the area.
 5. Student Clubs Handbook updates were completed on May 4, 2023.
 6. Esports events: Mario Kart (PTK), May 11, 2023 from 11 a.m. – 4 p.m.; Street Fighter 6 Launch Party: Friday, June 2, from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m.
 7. Student Appreciation BBQ – Wednesday, July 26, 2023 from 11 a.m. – 1 p.m. in the South Campus Courtyard.

Finance and Admin Services

Capital Projects Update –

Fire Services Training Center – The project is included in both the House and Senate versions of the 2023-25 Capital budget and is likely to be authorized. Once authorization has been received, the college, along with the Department of Enterprise Services (DES) will start an aggressive process to solicit, receive, review, and award the construction contract (with notice to proceed) by July 31st of this year.

IAQ Improvements at KBTC – This project will be completed in two phases. The first phase will address flooring replacement, abatement of asbestos and biological matter and localized ceiling work to support these activities. The second phase, now in design, will replace the HVAC system, replace all old spline-suspended ceiling and upgrade the old lights and control system to LED. Demoing carpet and moving on to phase 2 waiting for MOD.

South Campus Overhead Exterior Coiling Doors – This project replaces the balance of doors at Building B underfunded from previous biennium. This work is substantially complete with only punch list items remaining to correct. The warranty work seal needs to be adjusted. The contractor will check part delivery. This project is scheduled for completion by June 30, 2023.

South Campus Building E Masonry & Building Envelope Repairs - Water intrusion issues have been identified at the ground floor in two locations. Engineers have provided a design to correct the drainage issues. Final pricing for the project is being developed. This project is scheduled for

completion prior to June 20, 2023.

South Campus Site Safety Improvements – Contractor secured to develop a long-term landscape masterplan to recommend landscape revisions and best practices to support campus safety, sustainability, and maintenance procedures.

Work-study employment is a type of financial aid that a student earns in the form of a paycheck. Work-Study employment is meant to be a productive experience for everyone involved: the student, the employer, and the institution as well as the community. The program is either federally funded or state funded and is intended to help offset educational expenses. Wages are earned by working on campus and students are paid \$15.74 per hour.
