About the Occupational Therapy Assistant Program at Bates

The Occupational Therapy Assistant program started spring 2011. This nationally-accredited program takes **six quarters to complete** and a limited number of applicants are admitted every Fall quarter. The program is full-time, 7:45 a.m.-3:00p.m, Monday-Friday at the downtown campus. However, due to COVID-19, most lectures are Monday and Tuesday on Zoom and labs are in the classroom on Thursday and Friday. Wednesday is reserved for fieldwork.

Graduates are prepared as a generalist in occupational therapy with highly developed interpersonal and clinical skills that meet the demands of the profession. The curriculum combines biological and behavioral sciences with occupational therapy concepts and treatment principles for practice in a variety of clinical settings. Classes focus on practice and application of clinical skills. Proficiency in communication skills, critical thinking, problem-solving and working as a professional team member are important components of the curriculum. The curriculum is designed to teach students therapeutic, interpersonal, and technical skills that are needed to be successful when working in a variety of healthcare and educational settings.

Students learn through lecture, labs, hands-on practice, and collaborations with local facilities, such as Bates Childcare where children are evaluated and treated in our new clinic. There is also an OTA/OTR collaboration between Bates OTA program and University of Puget Sound OT program. In addition, twenty hours of fieldwork occur in three of four quarters students are enrolled. Fieldwork means that students are placed in different work settings to observe OT practitioners, other disciplines and educators who provide services to individuals with disabilities.

After completing the first four quarters of OTA courses with a grade of 2.0 or better in each course, students are placed full-time in two, eight-ten week clinical fieldwork experiences. After successfully completing the required clinical fieldworks with a grade of 2.0 or better, students earn an Associate's of Applied Science degree from Bates Technical College. Students then take a national board exam (NBCOT) and upon successfully passing the exam, they become a Certified Occupational Therapy Assistant (COTA) and are ready for employment.

The Program Mission

The mission of the Occupational Therapy Assistant program is to provide a supportive learning environment that will inspire and challenge students to become competent, caring, creative and conscientious professionals. The OTA program is based on the occupational therapy practice beliefs of therapeutic occupations as a way to remediate illness and maintain health. The curriculum is also based on the importance of establishing a therapeutic relationship that is occupation-based, client-centered, contextual, and evidence-based. At the core of the OTA curriculum is teaching values, knowledge, and skills so our graduates are able to provide occupational therapy services with compassion, respect, and competence.

Approximate Cost of the Program

- Tuition and fees for six quarters (based on 2022-2023 tuition fees) = \$11,440.72
 - Additional fees per credit: Hybrid course \$4.10 / Online course \$8.20
- Books – \$845.00
- Clinical liability insurance, health insurance, immunizations, TB testing, health/dental check, and criminal background check- approximately \$750.00 – depends on insurance



- Possible travel expenses to clinical fieldwork sites (5th and 6th quarters) – approximately \$500.00
- Additional expenses after program completion - National Board OTA Certification Exam \$555.00 and State OTA License- \$166.00
- Please note that these fees may be subject to change.

OTA Program Entry Requirements and Enrollment Process

1. Information sessions are virtual. **Contact:** <https://www.batestech.edu/information-sessions>
2. Complete the five OTA foundation courses (prerequisites) with a minimum grade of 3.0 for each course by winter quarter with the exception of MATH 100+ which 2.5 is allowable.
 - See the advisor in Student Services regarding the OTA foundation (prerequisite) courses. Show proof of being at least 18 years of age and high school completion or GED.
3. Pay the \$50 nonrefundable College application fee. Contact: cashier@batestech.edu or call 253-680-7405
4. Complete a minimum of 15 hours of observation or job shadowing with two different populations of clients that OT practitioners work with. This may include two different practice settings, such as a school, skilled nursing facility, or hand clinic, work hardening, etc.

5. Complete the OTA program enrollment application from the Bates OTA webpage after January 2, 2023. The deadline for submitting the application will be on the OTA webpage; this year it is June 30, 2023. The OTA program accepts a limited number of students for Fall quarter enrollment. Selections for the OTA program are based on a first-come, first-serve basis of applicants submitting a **completed application** with all required documents; however, **conditional enrollment** is also acceptable with the Course Planning Form filled out. This allows applicants to apply to the OTA program while still working on some of the foundation (prerequisite) courses.

The application tab provides the forms and the instructions for the following requirements:

- Complete the prerequisite courses and/or conditional enrollment form with all prerequisite courses completed by Summer, 2023.
- Provide a current letter of recommendation from an employer, supervisor or instructor who has known you for at least six months.
- Complete a written personal essay form in the application.
- Complete the Substitution Form for Observations or provide Documentation of Observation forms if you are able to observe a COTA or OTR in their work setting.
- Submit application via the link on the OTA program webpage.

Clinical Requirements for the OTA Program

Once accepted into the OTA program, the students will be oriented to documents that need to be submitted: current tuberculosis (TB) testing and immunizations (hepatitis B measles, mumps, rubella, tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis, varicella, and annual influenza, COVID-19 shots/booster), medical, dental health clearance and personal health insurance, clinical liability insurance coverage, and a national criminal background check.



Foundation coursework

Each of the five OTA foundation (prerequisite) courses must be completed with a grade of 3.0 or better except MATH 100+.

OTA foundation courses:

1. English Composition- 5 credits
2. Math 100+ level math- 5 credits
3. Anatomy & Physiology with lab- 5 credits
4. Introduction Psychology- 5 credits
5. Lifespan Psychology- 5 credits

Bates course offerings:

- ENGL101 or higher number
 MATH 107, 146, 171, 172, or 173
 BIOL&175 or BIOL 241 and 242 (both)
 PSYC 100
 PSYC 200

Bates Technical College offers a two-quarter track to guide students in acquiring these required prerequisites. Foundation courses can be taken in any order and at Bates or transferred to Bates from another institution. **Consult with OTA career advisor
